



1 Noriega Retail Corridor

From a wakeup cup at Home Coffee Roasters to a nightcap at Sunset Brewing Company, this vibrant street can keep you going all day long. Other useful highlights include a Walgreens with pharmacy and a convenient 76 gas station.

2 Sunset Rec Center

This beloved community space includes facilities for baseball, basketball, tennis, volleyball - and ping pong! In addition to open hours for these sports, classes are offered throughout the year. There's also a playground and gymnasium.

3 Safeway

This full-service Safeway branch is open 5am to midnight, and includes bakery, deli, and meat counters, as well as a florist and pharmacy. Parking is available too! Other nearby businesses include Duke's Hardware, several banks, and restaurants.

4 Outer Sunset Farmer's Market

This colorful weekly market features a variety of vendors including farmers and ranchers from around the Bay Area. Artists, live musicians, and activities for kids make it fun for the whole family - and it's open year-round!

5 Sunset Reservoir Park

At this park, you'll find a playground with a slide, swings, and more, in addition to long walking paths where neighbors and their dogs meet each other. Don't miss the incredible views of the Golden Gate Bridge, Lands End, and more!

6 McCoppin Square

This 9-acre park was extensively renovated in 2011. In addition to a playground, there are facilities for basketball, tennis, and baseball, as well as a contemplative garden. Or just pull up a spot on the spacious lawn and relax!

7 Taraval Retail Corridor

Taraval Street is one of the best stretches in the city for lovers of dumplings and other Chinese cuisine. Other options include Italian favorite Gold Mirror, classic diner Tennessee Grill, and shops from boutiques to Safeway and Walgreens.

8 Golden Gate Heights Park

This quiet neighborhood park features a beautiful new playground, opened in July 2021, and tennis courts. Climb the hill to see a well-preserved dune with rare spineflowers and wallflowers - and beautiful views out to the ocean!

9 Lycée Français de San Francisco

The Ortega campus of this highly-regarded French immersion school serves students in grades 6-12. LFSF students enjoy a 10:1 student-teacher ratio, according to Niche.com, and earn an IB bilingual diploma at graduation.

10 Grandview Park

Sometimes called "Turtle Hill" by residents, this park features walking paths winding up to the hilltop, where you are surrounded by a delicate community of dune plants. Don't miss the beautiful adjacent 16th Avenue Tiled Steps!

11 Jefferson Elementary

1849 23rd Avenue is in the SFUSD attendance area for this K-5 school, which serves 515 students. Jefferson features an arts program with rotations in visual arts, drama, singing, and dance, as well as an instrumental music program.

12 N Judah Streetcar

This Muni Metro line is a great option for getting around the city. Take it west to Ocean Beach for breezes and bonfires, or east to reach downtown, the ballpark, and Caltrain, with the Inner Sunset, Cole Valley, and Duboce Triangle on the way.

13 Irving Retail Corridor

More shops and restaurants abound along this strip. Take a lesson at Sunset Music, try the massaman chicken curry at Marnee Thai, check out the famous Mochi Donut Shop, and end your adventure with Pineapple King's strawberry mousse bun!

14 Golden Gate Park

This park has something for everyone in its 1000+ acres. Visit the many gardens and museums, many free to residents. Walk, run, or bike around in the fresh air. Enjoy art installations, live music, and food trucks. It's all yours to explore!

Highway Access & Additional Muni Options

Take 23rd Ave to Pacheco and turn onto 19th Avenue for highway access north and south. For days you'd rather leave the car at home, nearby transit options include:

- **6 Parnassus:** to Ferry Building via the Inner Sunset, the Haight, and Cole Valley
- **28 19th Ave:** to Ft. Mason, the Marina, Stonestown, and Daly City BART
- **29 Sunset:** to the Presidio, Sea Cliff, and Golden Gate and McLaren Parks
- **48 Quintara / 24th St:** to Ocean Beach, West Portal, Noe Valley, and the Mission
